Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

As I dated this note, I realized anew how much impact the fires have had on all of us. May 25 was the day earmarked for the beginning of my sabbatical, following what would have been the launch of our collective time of renewal; last Sunday would have been the commissioning of all of us to go forward into this adventure. Of course, the impact of the fire has changed that, and instead we will be focusing on what we can do here and now to bolster our community. Our other plans will wait until next year while we pour our energies into doing what we can for evacuees and for each other; all of us are still reeling from the scope of this fire and grieving various losses, from the loss of homes and tangible signs of family history to the loss of landscape and the loss of comfort with how the world works.

One way we will reach out to the community is to offer a bit of respite from reality. Beginning on June 2, our newly-formed Recovery Task Force will be holding weekly gatherings each Thursday evening to provide a place for evacuees, community members, and our church family to come together, have some fun, and share conversation. We hope it will be a way for people to escape the evacuation center for a while, to forget the news for a couple of hours, and to instead enjoy some light-hearted fun, develop relationships, and have a place to talk. The first gathering will be an evening of Bingo. So plan to come and join us from 6 – 8 p.m. on Thursdays in Perea Hall, and encourage others you know to join us. If you would like to be involved in making these events happen, please contact one of the task force members: Pam Abreu, Pat Halverson, Karyl Lyne, Lorenzo Martinez, Renee Soderlund, Linda Solyntjes, Sharon VanderMeer, or me.

As for worship, this Sunday we will talk about some of the praise psalms that close the book of Psalms. We will also share a healing service, so please have a bit of oil or water with you if you'd like to share in the anointing.

We plan to return to hybrid worship on Sunday, June 5, which is Pentecost. Wear those Pentecost colors that day, and remember that, sometimes, flames are an energizing, spiritually potent force, rather than a destructive one.
